#### **Our Mission:**

- 4. To participate in the Youth Employment Campaign, engage youth in constructive and productive activities, and increase their employment potentials through capacity building, exposure and volunteering and aligning with movements and organizations working on youth employment issues.
- 5. Provide leadership in building a better environment. Build alliances with progressive movements for restoring the ecological balance through regenerative activities and policy advocacy.

#### **Brief History:**

- PRO RURAL, is a registered grassroots development NGO operating in the North East India since 2009. Its mission is to support the development of the most disadvantaged section of the society, particularly the youth, women and the needy communities of the North Eastern region of India. It operates in the 7 states of the North Eastern Region of India. It has branch offices in Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh.
- Pro Rural was founded in 2004, and received registration as a society in 2009. The founding members got inspiration to form the society, following the two events in 2004; viz: NORTH EAST REGIONAL YOUTH SUMMIT ON ECOLOGY, organized by a consortium of NGOs together with the Chief Wild Life Wardens of Nagaland and Arunachal Pradesh, and secondly the launch of the Indian chapter of the Global YOUTH EMPLOYMENT CAMPAIGN, in Mizoram, Manipur, Meghalaya, Arunachal and Nagaland states of North East in late 2004 and 2005. Thus, livelihood issues of youth and indigenous communities form a core focus of Pro Rural.

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#### **ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT JOURNEY 2024**


The year 2024 saw us through a maze of activities under the Organizational Development (OD) process. Quest Alliance, our long-time support partner had sponsored a few dozen NGOs to go through the OD process as part of nurturing the growth of the Third Sector Actors (NGOs). Ms. Anita Ratnam, OD specialist was entrusted to walking with us on the OD process with systems support from the "Fourth Wheel", a well-known company.

A series of in-person workshops, virtual sessions, field base sessions, one-on-one discussions and interviews brought Pro Rural to deeply introspect and gearing for transformational changes in areas like organizational structure, including board and their participation, staffing and HR policy and practices, and to connect the dots to set the ground for higher performance.

One important outcome was to prepare the program pathway for the coming five to ten years, and collectively deciding what changes we want to see in which sectors, and to plan the structures and systems accordingly. In the re-structuring and re-shaping it was necessary to identify any redundancy, ticklish spots, incompetence and to reform or remove them.

At the close of the OD journey in October 2024, we must admit, it's being like a re-birth; with a small team gearing up to dedicate and lead for better performance. There has been a better coordination, ownership and participation in the team.

Another milestone worth a mention was Pro Rural's participation at the COP-29 at Baku, Azerbaijan, thanks to our Partner DASRA with their Re-build India Fund that facilitated and enabled the organization to represent the Indigenous Peoples and cultures of the Global South in positive climate action investing for a Green World.



# Promoting Youth Empowerment through Skills to Succeed (S2S) : A Transformative Partnership with Quest Alliance

"Entrepreneurship is the antidote to youth unemployment". The skills to succeed program, supported by quest alliance has set a trend among youth, who now believe they can develop sustainable livelihood with the rich and abundant natural resources in their own district or state. Each batch training starting with motivational programs from building achiever attitude to developing financial management skills, IT skills, business planning and marketing skills to hands on technical skills prepares them to develop and manage an enterprise.

Recognizing a clear shift in the career choices of young people—from traditional employment models to more independent and innovative pathways—the program has dynamically reoriented itself to focus on entrepreneurship development. The introduction of the boot camp model in village settings has proven to be a game-changer. This approach has brought hands-on, practical learning closer to the grassroots, where youth are now increasingly turning towards enterprise development as a viable and inspiring career choice.

As a result of this strategic direction, Pro Rural has successfully trained 412 youth across four different trades, conducted through 13 intensive training batches during the year. These trainings have not only imparted technical know-how but have also fostered confidence, creativity, and self-reliance among participants.









# Mobile Medical Camps and Awareness Programs: Supported by One Day's Wages (ODW) Bridging Health Gaps in Remote Nagaland

In 2024–25, Pro Rural took steps by partnering with One Day's Wages (ODW), USA to address critical healthcare challenges in remote regions of Nagaland. This newly-formed collaboration, fueled by ODW's support and contributions from local fundraising, paved the way for the launch of mobile health clinics and focused awareness programs in hard-to-reach villages.

This initiative is more than a medical outreach—it represents a grassroots movement for health equity. By equipping communities with both care and knowledge, Pro Rural and ODW are helping shape healthier, more resilient futures. It's a compelling example of how partnerships, local leadership, and compassion-driven action can make lasting impacts where they are needed the most.













#### Sowing Seeds of Sustainability: Livelihood Advancement with APPI Support

In a significant step towards sustainable rural development, Pro Rural, with support from the Azim Premji Philanthropy Initiative (APPI), launched a medium to long-term livelihood project in the Nsong Area. While Pro Rural has previously implemented short-term livelihood programs in collaboration with NABARD and other agencies, this initiative marks a major shift toward sustainable change.

The APPI-supported project was designed to tackle pressing issues faced by local farmers, such as low agricultural productivity, limited market access, and underdeveloped institutional support. Recognizing agriculture as a vital driver of economic stability and food security, the project promotes sustainable farming practices, agribusiness value chains, and strong community-led institutions.













#### **CII - North East CSR Connect**

Director and Assistant Director attended the North East CSR connect organised by CII (confederation of Indian Industries) at New Delhi from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> july 2024. Pro Rural also set-up a stall to show-case different programs and activities as a form of show-casing achievement and its preparedness to facilitate transformational engagement with communites. A few CSR project proposals were shared with a few corporates that participated.





## Inauguration of medical ambulance health service program.

On 16<sup>th</sup> Augest 2024, the Deputy Commissioner, Mr. Haizu Meru and the Chief Medical Officer (CMO) Peren, inaugurated the Pro Rural's medical ambulance mobile health service program to provide access to basic healthcare to the severely underserved communities in the peripheries of Peren District.







## Skills training in mushroom farming:

The oyster mushroom and Shiitake mushroom training program was conducted in Zhavame Village, Phek District, Nagaland, from 7<sup>th</sup> August to 20<sup>th</sup> Sep 2024. The training aimed to impart knowledge and practical skills on oyster mushroom cultivation and Shiitake mushroom to the local community, enhancing their livelihood opportunities through sustainable agriculture practices. The training was sponsored under SC/ST Hub, MSME Govt. of india through NERAMAC.

## **Promoting Agribusiness Value Chains for Marginal Farmers**

As part of Pro Rural's ongoing commitment to empower rural communities through sustainable development, a significant milestone was achieved with the official launch of the project titled "Sustainable Livelihoods Development for Marginal Farmers through Agribusiness Value-Chain" in the Ahthibung Block of Peren District. The event took place on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2024 at New Nkio village, marking the beginning of a comprehensive initiative aimed at transforming local farming practices and enhancing income for marginal farmers.







#### **Cultivating Change: Sustainable Livelihoods through AHT Support**

With the support of the Ashraya Hastha Trust (AHT), Pro Rural is implementing a sustainable livelihood development project focused on promoting cash crops among marginal farmers. This initiative aims not only to improve incomes, but to reshape the identity and practices of farming in the region.

The AHT project envisions a new generation of farmers—bold, healthy, knowledgeable, eco-conscious, and business-savvy—who are also deeply aware of the value of education and environmental conservation. Eleven village of the Kebai-Khelma region of Athibung block are covered under AHT supported project.







# **Garbage to Gold Training**

At the invitation of the Additional Deputy Commissioner and the Town Committee of Pfutsero Town, Two Programs were organised by Pro Rural. The first, on how kitchen waste can be composted and the second on how the bio-digester granules called "Garbage to Gold" powder is manufactured. The skills were transferred to members of the Chakhesang Women Welfare society.





#### **HCL** team visits Pro Rural

Pro Rural participated in the All-India competition thrown open by HCL foundation. It went through the intense due diligence process where HCL team visited field areas, interacted with governing board members, district athourities and inspected office set-up, staffing pattern and fund management styles etc. In the end Pro Rural received the first runners-up position.





# Project on Woolenised Jute: Supported by National Jute Board (NJB), Ministery of Textile, GOI

The "Project on Woolenized Jute" training was conducted in Pihekhu Village, Aghunaqa Block, Niuland District, Nagaland for 19 women. This initiative aimed to provide local women with skills in the woolenization process of coarse jute, enabling them to create value-added jute products. The training took place from 29<sup>th</sup> November to 15<sup>th</sup> December 2024. A total of 19 women from Self-Help Groups (SHGs) participated in this 15-day intensive program, which was led by Mr. Udayan Choudhury, a skilled trainer from the National Jute Board, Kolkata.













# **BOG** meeting

The Board of Governance meeting was held on 8<sup>th</sup> feb 2025, with a few important agenda. The meeting deliberated, among other things, the staff recruitment to be commenced in the near future.





# **Solar Technician Training: Green initiative partnership**

The Solar Technician Training was organized by Pro Rural in collaboration with Quest Alliance from 17<sup>th</sup> February to 22<sup>nd</sup> February. The training aimed to equip participants with practical skills and knowledge in solar technology and electronic repairs, empowering them to become self-reliant and explore employment opportunities around solar technologies.













# **Agripreneurs Conclave; Green Initiative**

The two-day "Agripreneurs Conclave" was organized by Pro Rural in collaboration with Quest Alliance, Bengaluru, at Ngam Village in the Nsong Circle of Peren District. The event, attended by 108 participants, was inaugurated on February 26, 2025,

by the Deputy Commissioner of Peren District. During the conclave, representatives from different villages submitted memoranda to the DC of Peren. The technical sessions were led by Quest Alliance team and Mr. Samuel, Director, Life Ministry Learning Centre and Mr. Lesehu Meru, Senior Regional Coordinator, CASA.











## **COP 29 United Nations Climate Change Conference**

Mr. Paul Lokho, Director, Pro Rural represented the indigenous communities the Global South at the UN conference on Climate Change in Baku, Azerbaijan. The initiative was taken up by DASRA – Rebuild India Fund team in association with the Methane Hub. The director gave a brief presention on how indigenous communities take care to live in harmony with nature and how their behaviour contributes to environmental sustainablility. He also advocated strenghtening the indigenous communities of the world and work with them to safeguard the environment.







#### **INSTITUTION BUILDING**

In the hills of Nsong area, a land blessed with forests and dense vegetation, lies some of the most fertile soil of Nagaland. Here, the earth yields abundantly, producing rich organic vegetables and the world-famous Naga King Chilli-the hottest and most aromatic, grown only in this land. For years, the people of Nsong area cultivated these treasures of nature but had no proper market to sell their produce. Seeing the untapped potential and the hope in the eyes of the farmers, **Pro Rural** initiated the formation of a Farmers' Producer Organization, which came to be known as the **Nsong Village Integrated Multipurpose Cooperative Society Ltd**, supported by **NABARD** What began humbly with **93 members** has grown. It took patience, capacity building, and constant encouragement to inspire people to join. Today, that small beginning has grown into a strong community of **172 shareholders**, and the FPO is fully functional since 2024. Together, we have ventured into promising businesses—such as poultry rearing and marketing of vegetables that carry the essence of the land:

- Cucumbers—soft, sweet, and juicy
- Maize—sticky, aromatic, and sweet
- Ash gourd—mild, tender, and full of natural flavor, loved across Nagaland
- King Chilli—fiery hot, aromatic, and uniquely distinct from any other, highly demanded across the country
- Ginger tender, aromatic, highly demanded across the country

This is the story of how the farmers of Nsong area are transforming their land produce into sustainable livelihoods, with unity, resilience, and vision for a better tomorrow.




