Under the A.H.T, Pro Rural supported the farmers by procuring the potato seedlings from Punjab with the agreement between Pro-rural and village councils of the 11 villages. This activity was conducted in response to the identified requirement of the farmers to cultivate potato as a commercial crop. The distribution of the seeds was supervised by Project Coordinator, Mr. Imnanukshi Phom and team of Pro Rural. This initiative profited a total of 307 beneficiaries from 11 villages of Kabai-Khelma area under Athibung block. In view of this, the status of the plantation's progress will be determined by late January or early February.



Pro Rural conducted a comprehensive health awareness program at Azailong village. On 8th October, a session on HIV prevention, drugs and substance abuse, particularly to men and youths were covered. In another session on 17th October, hand hygiene and communicable diseases was organized at Government High School (GHS) Azailong led by Nurse Tinu sensitizing 36 school students. Followed by a separate discussion centered on tetanus awareness and environmental sanitation to lactating mothers and house wives on 18th October. Additionally, topics on role of clean surroundings and timely immunization were also discussed.



The HWAI team documented 30 women vendors for profiling and scrutiny, with the goal of facilitating credit linkages. In this regard, on 4th October, the HWAI supported 14 beneficiaries in obtaining FSSAI and UDYAM registrations at WENN Bazaar. Additionally, the team explored potential collaboration opportunities and new schemes that could benefit the women vendor by assisting the beneficiaries to open accounts in Cooperative banks.



S2S Skills & Entrepreneurship

S2S conducted Livestock Poultry Farming training in Pukhato village under Niuland District to empower local farmers with essential knowledge and practical insights. This training witnessed a total of 86 beneficiaries. Dr. Sungkum Jamir and Dr. V Qhelitoli Sema from Niuland Veterinary Dispensary shared valuable information on sustainable poultry farming practices, effective preservation methods, and preventive measures against poultry-related diseases and flues. Ms. Ebipeni N Mozhui, Manager Rural Bank Niuland educated the beneficiaries on financial literacy, and effective money management to sustain and grow their poultry businesses. Furthermore, the team also assisted beneficiaries with account openings and scheme related queries.
